

STRATHKELVIN WRITERS' GROUP - COMPETITION RULES

Competitions are open to **fully paid-up** members and postal members. One manuscript per member per competition. Entries to be presented as if sending to an editor for publication, on A4 paper typed on one side only and, except for poetry, use double line spacing, numbered pages and your **one-word pseudonym** in the header. **Change your pseudonym for each competition.** Begin typing halfway down the first page, with no indent in the first paragraph. For **poetry** use single line spacing. Your **Cover page** should include the title, pseudonym, word count/number of lines of poetry, Strathkelvin Writers' Group and competition category.

If you are posting your entry then, into a **small envelope**, put a note of your real name and phone number. On the outside of this envelope write the competition **category, title and pseudonym**. Seal the small envelope and attach it to your manuscript and cover page with a paper clip. Place in a larger envelope with the **category, title and your pseudonym** written on the outside. Please use only paper clips to secure manuscript pages.

Submissions must reach Adrienne by midnight on the submission date (Please note the submission day is now a Thursday, not a Friday. However, early submissions are very welcome to help avoid last-minute problems with processing of entries.) **Any submissions which are late, or which don't comply with the word count limits won't be considered for the competition.** However, they will normally still receive a critique. You cannot submit an entry that has previously won a SWG competition.

Still not sure? Ask Adrienne or a committee member.

We have seven competitions each year and several trophies are awarded plus a cash prize of £100 for poetry. The **Strathkelvin Writers' Group trophy** is presented to the member who accumulates the highest number of points.
